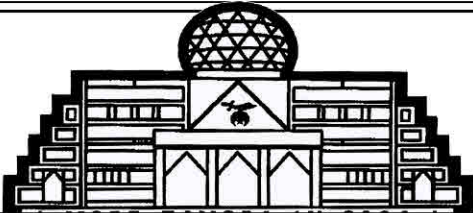

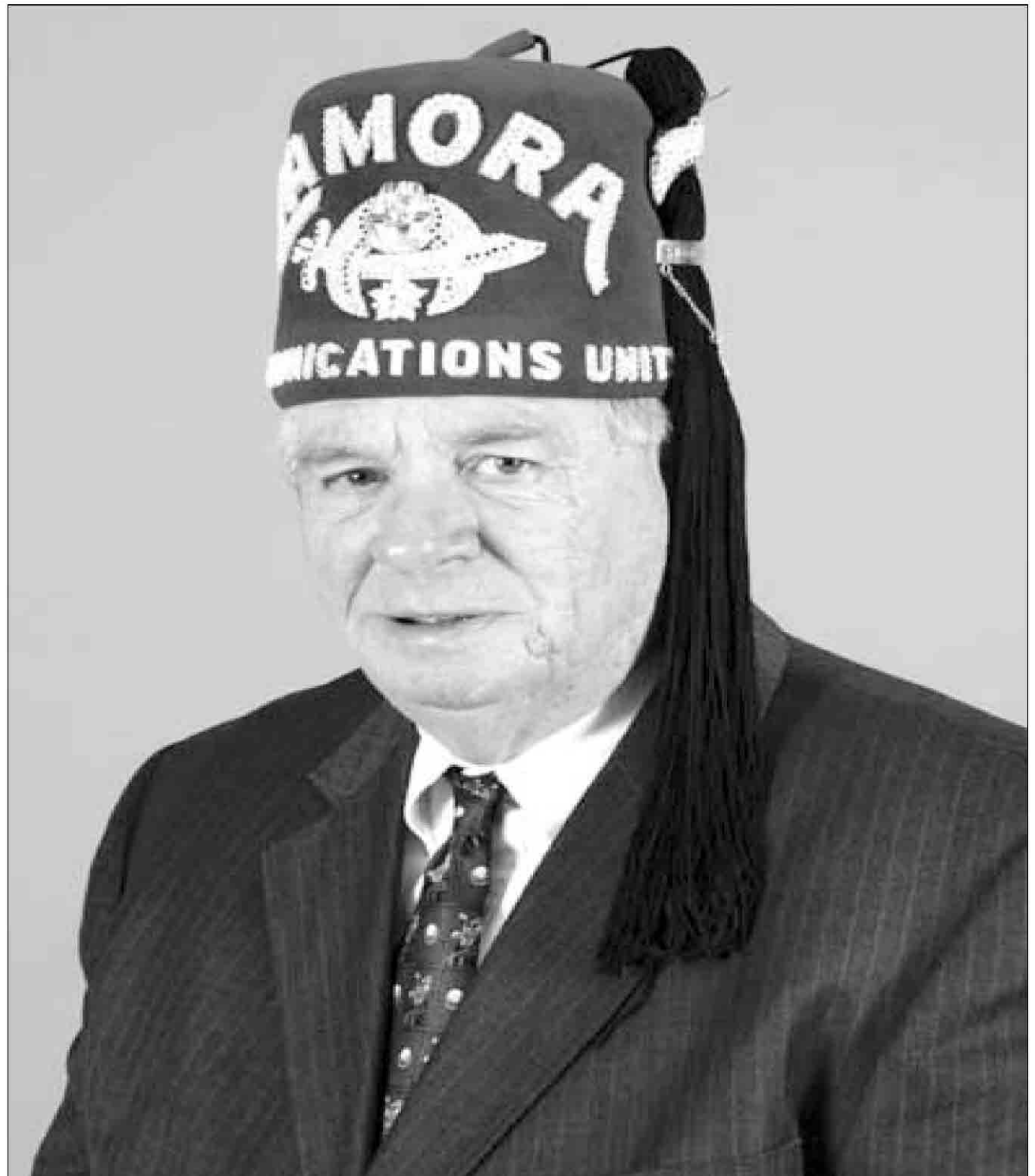

From the Potentate...



The last 12 months have passed way too quickly. As I look at my initial list of Zamora goals for 2011, there are still many that have not been met. Possibly I set my ideals to high although I am proud of Zamora, the Nobility and the accomplishments of the last year. The great majority of the Nobility understands that we are Masons first and we need conduct ourselves as such.

Membership is always a major concern of any organization. In the beginning of 2011 the naysayers touted predictions of a six hundred member loss because of the \$38.00 yearly dues increase. The actual number is less than 200 and surprisingly, the 2011 dues are still arriving daily. When the new creations are included, our net loss will be less than 150. This number is far from ideal although many on our list have been visited by the Black Camel and we are unaware of the passing. Others have simply moved out of our area or have been severely impacted by the less than

desirable economic conditions. During my club visits it became very apparent that many of Alabama's rural areas have lost their major sources of employment. Winston County lost two major employers and the reported unemployment there is over 14%. Despite this, The Free State Shrine Club provided over \$9,400 for the Paper Sale which is more than any other Shrine Club or Unit. Those Nobles are serious about making sure the Hospital Children are getting the care they need. Considering all of the adversities the Zamora Nobility faced in 2011, I believe the membership loss is understandable and much less than expected.

Our Temple is in much better condition than it was last January due to the efforts of many but mainly because of Noble John Galbreath. As an example, the largest physical challenge this year that we all knew about was the 25 year old roof. It needed to be replaced but the price was far beyond our monetary ability. John's knowledge and daily on site supervision saved us over \$200,000 below even the lowest bid. We now have a roof that is more waterproof than when the building was new.

The four major fundraising activities for 2011 under the daily control of Noble Terrell Yates were quite successful. The unforeseen economic conditions coupled with the Spring storms that devastated much of Zamora's area of responsibility cut deep into our fundraising potential. Despite these obstacles, the Units, Clubs and Nobility worked hard and dug deep to make sure the fundraisers were successful. The Gadsden Shrine Club was especially active and raised more money for Zamora that was ever

expected and I am very grateful for their efforts.

Now to the Children, our most important challenge and the Shrine mission. If we were able to access the total number of children that Zamora has medically assisted since our Charter was granted in 1890 and the first Hospital was opened in 1922 to today, it would be an astronomical number. Zamora and you as a Shriner, through your personal efforts and monetary giving have provided many children with a useful life, a chance to walk, play, interact with others and in many cases their very life.

As of my last count, we are now providing our healthcare services to over 240 children. Zamora as an entity and you as an individual are providing many children with a chance to end their suffering, be like their friends and participate with society. That, to take advantage of a word, is quite "noble". The Zamora Roadrunners under the direction of Noble Jim Kennedy has had a very busy year. The Roadrunners are a basically a group of Nobles that enjoy their assignment and look forward to their next trip, their chance to help make a difference in a child's life.

As you read this month's newsletter, you will see many Nobles who have excelled in one way or another and were recognized at the awards banquet on December 12th. It was a challenge to restrict the awards to these Nobles as there were and are many deserving individuals at Zamora. Some work more than others, some play more than others but basically, most all have fun and enjoy the camaraderie. We all enjoy watching the motorized units perform, the clowns act and the parades we attend. We enjoy the parties, Temple functions, the Unit and Club meetings. We enjoy being with people we want to associate with, we have a cause and we have a common bond, we are Shrine Masons.

I thank you for the opportunity you gave me to serve a second term as your Potentate during 2011.

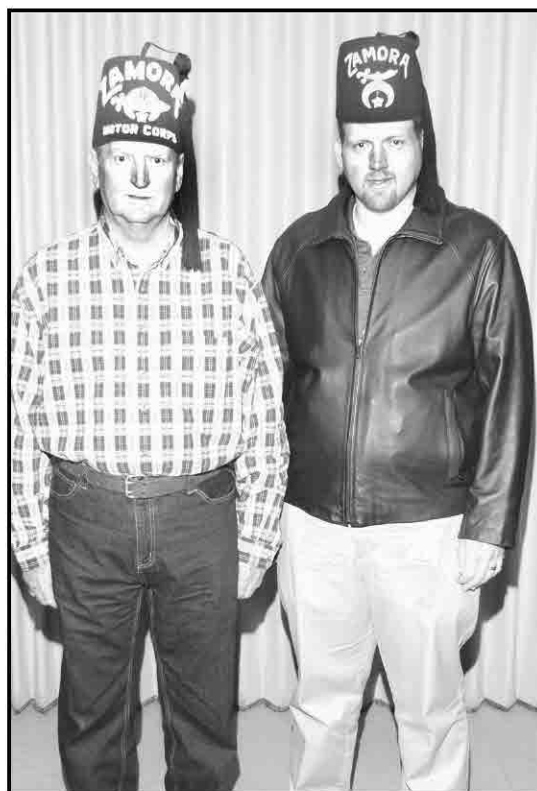

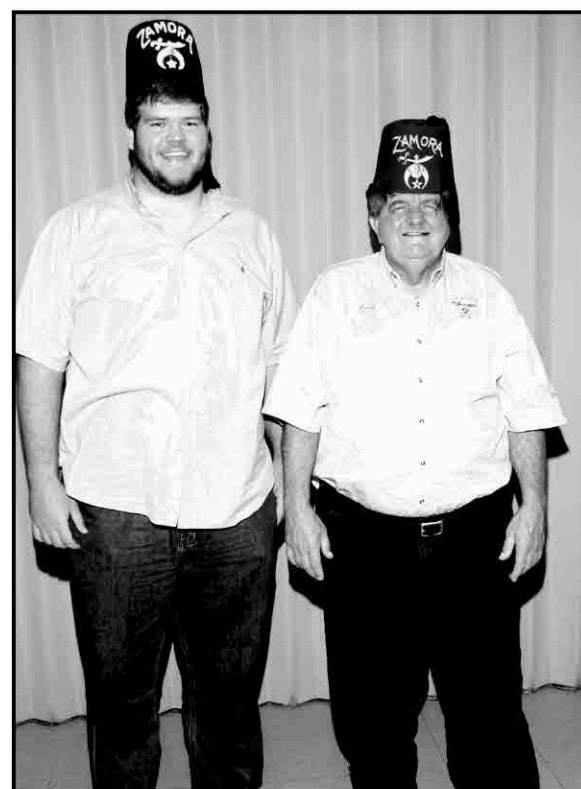
