Brian Fason said that the process of getting a personalized Shrine tag was pretty easy as long as the personalization is still available. He has had a Shrine tag since 2010 but this was his first opportunity to get a personalized version. Just go to your local DMV and ask for a personalized Shrine tag. Brian filled out the paper work and a couple weeks later the tag arrived in the mail.

**Who may purchase license plates in this category?** Residents of Alabama who are vehicle owners and members of the Ancient Arabic Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine for North America.

**Is there any documentation required to be presented by the registrant prior to purchasing this plate?** Yes. Registrants attempting to purchase these plates must present a membership card or other membership documentation to the license plate issuing official signifying membership as a Shriner.

**What registration fees are associated with the purchase of this license plate?** \$15.00- \$890.00 depending on the type of vehicle being registered.

**May the plates be personalized?** Yes

**Additional fees:** \$50.00 annually for pre-numbered or personalized plate. \$5.00 when metal plate is issued.

**Are plates in this category transferable? If so, to whom?** The plates are not transferable between vehicle owners.

**What type of vehicles may this plate be displayed upon?** Private passenger automobiles, pickup trucks, motorcycles and pleasure motor vehicles (i.e., recreational vehicles).

**How are the net proceeds from the purchase of this plate distributed?** The net proceeds of the \$50 are distributed to the Juvenile Health Care Board of the City of Piedmont, Alabama. The net proceeds of the \$5 shall be distributed to the Department of Revenue.

**How often does the license plate design change?** Every five (5) years.

## OP-ED

First Ceremonial Master Noble Johnny Petterman submitted this essay as food for thought as something that all Zamora Nobles should read.

Think for a moment.... Do you own a masonic ring? A Fez? A shirt, tie, or other article of your wardrobe that has a symbol that represents Masonry; or an associate body? Do you have a tag on your vehicle that is a Shrine or Blue Lodge plate? Now, I will take it a bit farther. Are you connected on a form of social media? Facebook? Twitter, or others? Do you display symbols or events associated with our fraternity on these sites? As we drive on our daily commute, are you operating a vehicle with a special tag or emblem attached with symbols of our fraternity? Most of us will answer yes to more than one of these questions.

Most of us are known by our neighbors, coworkers, employers, family, etc. that we are Masons, Scottish Rite, York Rite, Shriners or other affiliated body of Masonry. I am no different. Recently, I have had a few times where someone that is not associated with our fraternities came to me asking about people that have made social media post that are controversial, political, or a profanity laden rant. Guess what??? The people making some of these post are members of one or more of the fraternities previously mentioned. There are Facebook pages covered with our symbols and has our events listed as the place to be surrounded by post venting personal issues and controversial

beliefs. I have also been asked about a post where someone within our Temple felt that they were being mistreated by one (or more) of our members. The ensuing post was about how "Masons and Shriners shouldn't act like that".

We as Masons and Shriners are not perfect. It is known as men we are all with fault. Often we will even disagree amongst ourselves or see a post by someone who is upset or that has a particular belief. Dealing with society is often difficult, and even the daily commute may lead to occasional feelings of road rage. In these instances, we must remember who we are and realize people are making decisions on joining or affiliating with our fraternities based on a quick judgment of our actions.

*Imagine for a moment.*

You cut someone off in traffic or perhaps make a lewd gesture.... As you pass them guess what they see? The square and compass on your vehicle, the Scimitar or the specialty license plate?

You enter into an argument with someone and your behavior isn't truly appropriate. Were you wearing our symbols on your clothing? Your ring?



You posted a reply or a rant on social media airing your opinion or belief that is not the opinion or belief of our fraternal brothers. Perhaps about police brutality, the legalization of marijuana, someone that said something ugly to you, or simply a post full of profanity posted on the World Wide Web for the world to see.

You have a disagreement with a Brother/Noble that escalates to a heated argument or threat of turning to a fight.

In all of these situations those that are a witness to this behavior have cast judgement of your character and who you represent.

We are not perfect. We do have opinions. We will, at some time, not be in total agreement; but as a Master Mason and A Noble, your actions should reflect what our obligations require. Act on the square and use the compasses. We will make mistakes, but think before you act. Take the high road. Doing the right thing is almost never the easiest path but it is always the right path to take. We all know our obligations. If you have forgotten visit your lodge and refresh your memory. What is the definition of Noble? As a noun it is *“a person of noble rank or birth.”* but as an adjective (a word to describe) it is *“having or showing fine personal qualities or high moral principles and ideals”*

So from one imperfect man to another, remember we must try to live up to whom we suppose ourselves to be, improve our image to the potential candidates of our order and those who are supporters of our cause. Without men wanting to become Masons and Shriners or people wanting to support our cause we will cease to exist. Our behavior is critical to our success.

2. THIS MAY BE OBTAINED BY HAVING THE INDIVIDUAL CALL HIS HOMEOWNERS CARRIER AND HAVE THE RECREATIONAL VEHICLE INCLUDED UNDER HIS HOMEOWNERS POLICY AND AN UMBRELLA OF \$1,000,000 ADDED. THIS USUALLY COSTS SOMEWHERE BETWEEN \$75.00 TO \$100.00 ANNUALLY.

## **PROPOSE CHANGES TO ZAMORA BYLAWS**

AT THE NEXT MEETING ON NOVEMBER 9, 2016, THE RECORDER WILL READ THE FOLLOWING PROPOSE CHANGE TO THE ZAMORA BYLAWS. AFTER ANY DISCUSSIONS OR QUESTIONS, A VOTE WILL BE TAKEN THE ACCEPT OR REJECT THE CHANGES.

**PARA 2.7 AS READ:** Life Membership. Life membership in this temple are governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

**AMENDED PARAGRAPH 2.7 TO READ:**

### **2.7 LIFE MEMBERSHIPS.**

(1) All members who are sixty-five (65) years of age and who have paid dues for a term of thirty-five (35) consecutive years shall become life members within the Zamora Shrine Temple without payment of any further dues other than the Shrine International per capita and Shrine Hospital assessment fee.

(2) Any members who is under or over sixty-five (65) years of age without thirty-five (35) consecutive years may in accordance with Shriners International Bylaws paragraph 332.6(a)(3) become a Life Member.

(3) The Potentate shall automatically become a life member upon completion of his term in office. He will still be required to pay the Hospital Assessment Tax and the Per Capita Tax.
