PROPOSED CHANGES TO ZAMORA BYLAWS

AMENDMENTS TO THE ZAMORA BYLAWS THAT WERE PRESENTED TO THE NOBLES AT THE STATED MEETING ON MAY 25, 2016 WILL BE VOTED ON DURING THIS MEETING. THE FOLLOWING ARE THE PROPOSED CHANGES:

- 1. Added at the end of each item the Shriners International Bylaws paragraph reference.
- 2. Para 2.7 As read: Life Membership. Life membership in this temple are governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

Amended paragraph 2.7 to read:

- 2.7 Life Memberships. (332.6) (1) All members who are sixty-five (65) years of age and who have paid dues for a term of thirty-five (35) consecutive years shall become life members within the Zamora Shrine Temple without payment of any further dues other than the Shrine International per capita and Shrine Hospital assessment fee.
- (2) Any members who is under sixty-five (65) years of age may in accordance with Shriners International Bylaws paragraph 332.6(a)(3)(i) become a Life Member. (3) Any members who is over age sixty-five (65) years of age and has paid less than thirty-five (35) consecutive years may in accordance with Shriners International Bylaws paragraph 332.6(3)(ii) become a Life Member. (4) The Potentate shall automatically become a life member upon completion of his term in office. He will still be required to pay the Hospital Assessment Tax and the Per Capita Tax.
- 3. Para 3.8 As read: Admission. A Noble may not be admitted to this temple unless he exhibits to the temple an official Shrine card for the current year.

Amended to read: Para 3.8 Admission.

- 3.8 Admission. A noble may not be admitted to this temple unless he exhibits to the temple an official Shrine card for the current year and a current blue lodge card. (339.1)
- 4. Para 8.3 AS read: Alcoholic Beverages. The consumption of alcoholic beverages during parades and ceremonials is forbidden by those nobles participating therein.

Amended para 8.3 to read: 8.3 Alcoholic Beverages. The consumption of alcoholic beverages during parades and ceremonials is forbidden by those nobles participating therein. Also no alcoholic beverage will be consumed during any events that Zamora Shiners is sponsoring children activities at the temple or Zamora Park.

Z Lounge



RoadRunners

Each Shrine Temple has a special unit of transporters called the Road Runners. Road Runners have driven millions of miles bringing children to Shriners Hospitals for Children® — Greenville. For each trip, they pick up a local child and their family, drive them to the hospital for treatment, and then return with them back home. The transportation is free of cost to the child's family, but the Road Runners say they are paid with smiles from the child.

When asked why they volunteer so much of their time. Road Runners simply reply that when they look at what the families are going through with the children, they are happy to drive any distance to help them. By Greenville Shrine Hospital Admin

In the Month of May 2016 the Zamora Road Runners completed 6 van trips.

1 trip to the St Louis MO Shrine Hospital we transported 1 child and family.

5 trips to the Greenville SC Shrine Hospital, we transported 7 children with families.

In the Month of May 2016 the Transportation fund provided 3 hotel stays for 3 children and families that provided their own transportation to the Greenville SC Shrine Hospital.

In total Zamora changed the lives of 11 children.

Shrine Tag Report



Personalized Shrine Tags are now available!

The State of Alabama has changed the way they do specialized license plates & have bumped the Shrine tag from \$25 to \$50. They did put us in the highest charity category so now we get \$45.75 for each tag sold. They are also allowing motorcycle tags & personalization now. Personalized tags are allowed six spaces. The state charges \$50 for the personalization. This should be a one-time fee.

Of the \$45.75 we get for each tag sold 82% goes to Shrine Hospitals of America to be distributed to our Shrine Hospitals. The 18% we get for each tag sold in a Shrine Center's jurisdiction is sent back to the Shrine Center to use to transport the children & one family member back & forth from their Shrine Hospital appointments.

Show how proud you are to be a Shriner. Put that tag on all your vehicles. You don't have to wait until renewal time, you can get the tag any time of the year. Just take your old tag off & take it in along with your dues card & pay the fee. We are passing the million dollar point with tags issued this month. We can double that quickly if everybody will get their tags!

Rentals

Zamora is trying out new types of rentals. On June 12th 2016 Zamora partnered up with the Alabama Speed Club and held a racing and drift competition. What was different about this rental was that the Alabama Speed Club specifically request a Sunday only event. In the past we have never done this before, but as Donna Hicks the Zamora facilities manager said that "the money was good for a shut down day that we usually don't have anything here" Donna also mentioned that the potential to have multiple rentals over a whole weekend that can increase our overall money intake. "We did \$2671 in profit on this one event. In other words we would not have made that money if we had not opened to let them do this. That gave me leeway where we can do this some more". Donna hopes that in the future we can maximize the full weekend to increase our rental sales.

The Zamora Shrine Center was a great location to hold this competition. With two large parking lots one whole lot was open for the racing, leaving the back straight away as a pit road. Additionally, a whole car show was held indoors for non racing events. Half of the proceeds were donated to the Zamora general fund. This was one of our most successful first time rentals. It was so successful that the Alabama Speed Club has already rented the facilities again for a second Drift Temple on Sunday, October 2nd from 10am - 8pm. ASC Co-Owner Nick Cosby had this to say about Drift Temple 2 "We're coming back! Bigger and better! All are welcome to participate! 1/2 of proceeds will be donated to Zamora Shrine Temple.
