
From Your Potentate...




There will be 3 fast entry lines when you come in the park (by the airplane)

Notice to all the Nobles of Zamora we are starting a new phone calling system




First Lady's Message...

News from Cincinnati

Caiden's Story

Caiden and his mother moved to the rural community of Arcade. New York when he was seven years old. Now at 13, he has the demeanor of a smart, independent teenager, with a gift for learning things guickly. That includes musical instruments like the saxophone, piano or even the new ukulele which he has recently taught himself to play.

That same independent spirit led Caiden to try cooking french fries for himself one Saturday night while his mother Kimberly was out. As soon as she arrived home. Kimberly could smell the odor of hot grease coming from the kitchen.

"I could tell right away he had the oil too hot," she said, but by the time she got to the kitchen, Caiden had spilled the grease up his arm and chest.

Kimberly rushed Caiden, who was wearing nothing but shorts and bare feet, also leaving her purse behind, to the local emergency room where they spent two hours with no treatment. Once seen. Caiden and his mother were dispatched almost immediately to Shriners Hospital for Children-Cincinnati for treatment of 2nd and 3rd degree burns on 16% of his body.

The next days were a whirlwind-"I remember riding this weird liftthing." Caiden said of the receiving dock where he was brought into Cincinnati Shriners Hospital. His mother has a clearer memory

of spending the first two nights in acute care rooms, then moving to one of the family care units. She is also grateful for the help they received with clothes and spending cash after arriving here with next to nothing.

As he waited to see Dr. Petra Warner, now on his way to full recovery, Caiden entertained the staff in the Family Care center with a song on his ukulele. At his appointment, Dr. Warner determined that he would not need surgery, just a return visit in two to three weeks for an assessment of one possible graft site.
