New Imperial Potentate Elected for Shriners International for 2019-2020



Zamora Chief Rabban Kirk "Moose" Pearson, Jr.; Imperial Sir Jeff Sowder; and Zamora Potentate Illustrious Sir Jerry Wayne Thomas.

Imperial Sir Jeff Sowder was elected as Imperial Potentate at the 2019 Imperial Session held in Nashville, Tennessee, which was held June 30- July 4. Imperial Sir Sowder is a "self declared small town farmer" from Toronto, Kansas. Sowder was the first Past Grand Master to be elected as Imperial Potentate. Imperial Sir Sowder and First Lady Cheryl Sowder expressed their excitement at the opportunity afforded them for the upcoming year.

One important piece of legislation addressed at the Imperial Session was to help restore the Masonic/Shrine relationship of members in Arkansas. Since November of 2012, Masons in the state of Arkansas were forbidden to be members of the Shrine because of an order of their Grand

Lodge. Several Masons were expelled over the rule.

The current Grand Master of Arkansas' Grand Lodge, Jesse Sexton, issued an edict that recognized Shriners International as a "civic organization." This edict permits Arkansas Masons to again be members of Shriners International. Imperial Sir Sowder immediately sent a letter to all Shriners in Arkansas announcing the new change.

In the letter, Sowder wrote, "In response to significant positive steps taken by the Grand Lodge of Arkansas at its February 2019 Grand Communication, Shriners International passed a resolution during its 2019 Imperial Session, that as of July 16, 2019, all new initiates for Shrine membership in Arkansas must be Master Masons

in good standing.

"The resolution has no current impact on Arkansas Shriners who are not currently Masons. However, Arkansas Masons are now immediately permitted to petition for membership in our two Arkansas Shrine Temples, Scimitar Shriners and Sahara Shriners."

Imperial Sir Sowder also discussed his program for Shrine Membership. As all Nobles are aware, they are members of the Membership Committee. He has started a program he has named "Just One" where members are encouraged to recruit only one member this year and in doing so will double our membership. Information was made available to those in attendance.

For the meeting, we will review safety procedures, HIPPA rules, Sexual Harassment policy, as

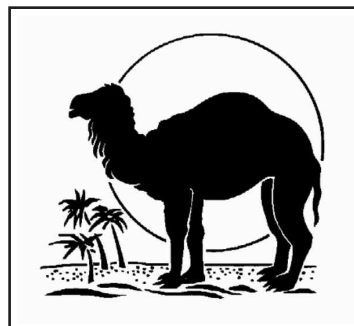
well as updating drivers records. Please RSVP by Monday, September 16 at 205-956-3636 and tell us what dessert or vegetable you are bringing.

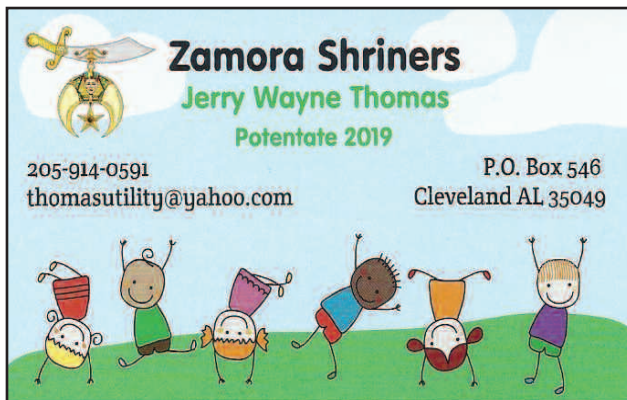

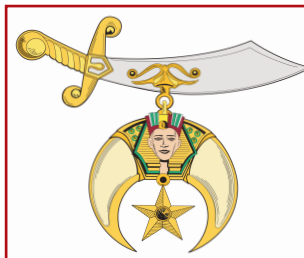
those in attendance to get more involved with the Road Runners.
