Meet Greenville Hospital Patient -Micah Fowler


Micah David Fowler was born in September 2013. He was our miracle that the Lord brought to us through adoption. We were a little surprised when we found out that Micah was born without thumbs. Because of the absence of thumbs they chose to do many tests including genetics testing to see if there was a reason why he had no thumbs. Every test came back negative; there was no medical reason why he had the hand issues.

He had a left thumb there, but it was a hyperplastic thumb which meant it had no bone and no joint. His right hand had just the four fingers, no thumb, but he had the first joint there, but no actual thumb.

At 6 months old we were sent to Children's Hospital Birmingham to have Orthopedics look at his hands and see what they would recommend as treatment. There was nothing they could do at that point but wanted to keep evaluating until he was two years old and then possible surgery. I was concerned that he would not be getting what he needed so I chose not to take him back to Children's but see what my baby could do on his own with the Lord training his brain to adapt. He was a very high functioning two year old with the hands God had given him then. I then had someone tell me to reach out to the Shriners!!! Best decision ever!!!

In October 2015 we were in Birmingham to go to

Disney on Ice, and we were waiting on Micah to finish a nap so we were sitting on the tailgate



talking, and someone mentioned that the Shriners were parking cars right behind us. I said that it was no mistake that God had put us there for that moment of meeting Don Baker, who talked with us and said we needed to be evaluated. We got the number to call, and within two weeks we had an evaluation with Greenville Hospital. That was the first trip, and we were transported by George Stewart and Brian Fason. They were awesome and very helpful when navigating all this with us. Micah immediately took to those two and never wanted to leave Greenville. He cried because we had to go home!

We had another evaluation a month later to see Dr. Timothy Dew. He is the amazing, kind, gentle, and Christian hand surgeon we were blessed to have as Micah's hand surgeon. They explained that, even though Micah was a highly functioning two year old, as he continued to

grow, things would be more difficult as he got older - from but-



Did you know? Shriners International Provides Memorial, Burial, and Funeral Protocol Information

MEMORIAL AND **BURIAL SERVICES**

Circumstances.

A Shrine memorial or funeral service is permitted under limited circumstances, when requested by the deceased noble's family. Neither service should be held in place of a religious service or the traditional Masonic service. They may, under unusual circumstances, supplement the Masonic service, but they should not take its place. Both services are intended as a tribute to nobles who have performed meritorious service on behalf of a subordinate lodge or, more especially, the Shrine.

Honor Aisle.

side or location where the memorial or seated or in attendance. funeral service is to be held, uniformed units are used to form the honor aisle (from the curb to the entrance of the officers and nobles should remove building or graveside).

Order of Reception.

tons, to writing, to zippers and other tasks that would cause him frustration. Dr. Dew was going to take the index finger on each hand and create Micah thumbs.

Micah's first surgery was then scheduled for July 2016. Dr. Dew removed the hyperplastic thumb and moved Micah's index finger over, shortened it, rotated it, and made him his first functioning thumb.

What followed was four weeks of casting and three weeks of splint, and he healed so well and so quickly. We were so blessed. He healed and was ready to get the right hand done. It was the same process, just the other hand. It was scheduled for March of 2017. He did well and had no problems with either surgery. Now, we go once a year for Dr. Dew to make sure all is well. We go this month for our second yearly check






Membership Committee Receives Much Needed Break


