
Knotted Fleece Quilt/Blanket

With Love our group has prepared this fleece blanket kit for you to put together and use for many years. Each square was hand cut and you may find some irregular size fringes, just be sure to knot matching fringe to the other square by count not by size. The bag you have received the blanket kit in is perfect for keeping your blanket in while you are working on it and for storage when you are not using. Enjoy your fleece blanket when done – curl up with your beautiful, cozy blanket.

First you will need to design your quilt. All the squares are pre-cut, you need to layout your blanket pattern. You have multiple colors, you need to decide on a design – see a couple of suggestion on back. There are many different options. You can make stripes, checkerboards, or a random pattern. If you can; lay out your squares in whatever pattern you want across the floor or a large table. Depending on what design you choose there may be an extra square.

Decide what you like best. It is a personal choice. When you are happy with your design, stack the squares in each long row (column) in order, keeping the first square on top. Make one pile for each row/column. You might want to number your rows.

Tie together the rows. Now you can start assembling your rows. Take two fleece squares that are beside each other in a row of your design. Lay them side by side with the fringe touching. Take the top piece of fringe on the sides of the squares that are touching. Double knot the fleece fringe together. Continue down the whole side of the square. Once two are connected, take the next square in the row sequence of your blanket. On the opposite side of where the two squares are already connected, attach the next square in the same way as the first. Continue this until your row is completely knotted together. Do the same thing for the remaining rows of your blanket. If you miss





a fringe – stop, take out the knots back to where you missed one and then continue your knots with the correct fringes.

NOTE: Be sure to not pull too hard while knotting your fringe. It will cause your fleece to not lay flat and mess up the flow of the whole quilt.

Attach the rows together. Once you have completed your 5 long rows/columns, you need to attach the rows/columns together to finish the blanket. Starting in the same fashion as with the singular squares, knot the fringe of the rows together. Continue all the way down the rows until the two are attached together. Do the same thing for the remaining rows/columns. Once the last rows/columns are joined, you should have a complete blanket.




